



PVC Foam SDS Statement

Novagard Solutions complies fully with the Federal Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) "Hazard Communication Standard" (29 C.F.R. Part 1900.1200).

The purpose of the Standard is to insure that the hazards of all chemicals produced or imported are evaluated and information concerning those hazards is properly communicated to any affected employee. Employees must be advised of certain hazardous components in excess of 1% and carcinogens in excess of 0.1%. However, the Standard also provides that articles which do not release or otherwise result in exposure to a hazardous chemical under normal conditions of use are exempt.

"Article means a manufactured item other than a fluid or particle: (i) which is formed to a specific shape or design during manufacture; (ii) which has end use function(s) dependent in whole or in part upon its shape or design during end use; and (iii) which under normal conditions of use does not release more than very small quantities e.g., minute or trace amounts of a hazardous chemical (sic) and does not pose a physical hazard or health risk to employees"

29 C.F.R Part 1910.1200 (pp. 824)

By definition, all Foam Seal PVC foam products are considered to be "articles" and are therefore exempt from the requirements of the standard. Consequently, as an article and a non-hazardous material, there are no provisions requiring the preparation of a Safety Data Sheet (SDS).
